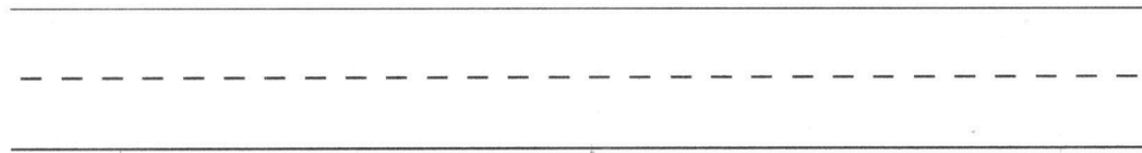
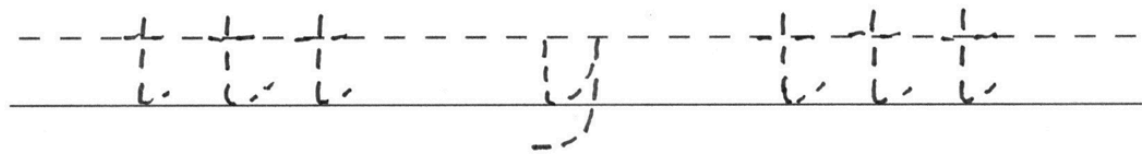
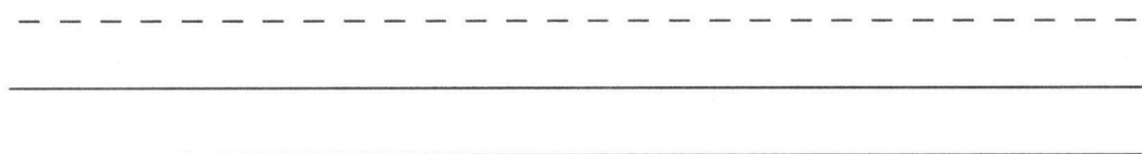
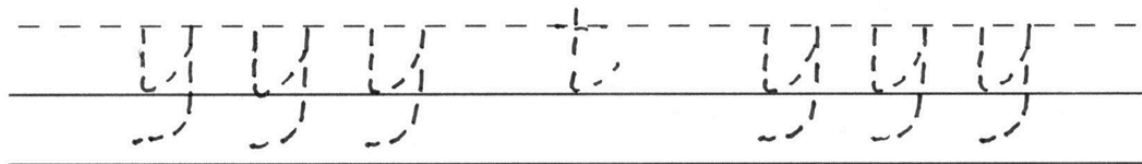
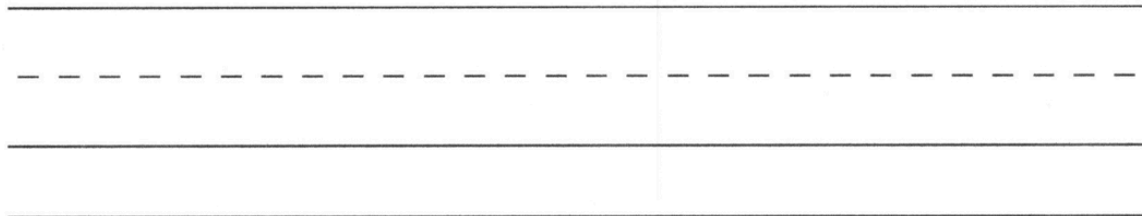
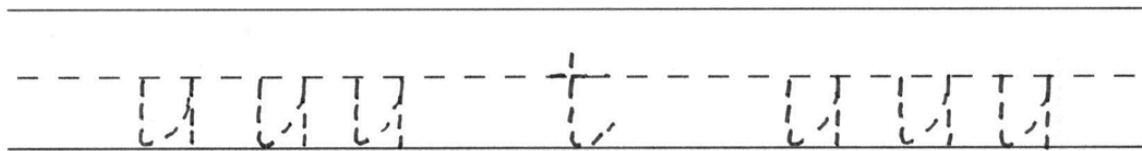


Lesson 7: The 'u' Family

There are three letters in the 'u' family—'t', 'u' and 'y'. The letters are made with a downward stroke, which bends to the right as the pencil approached the bottom line. The line then curves upward. The 't' is finished when it gets a third of the way to the dotted line. For the 'u' and 'y', the stroke is continued until it hits the dotted line. At the dotted line, there is another downward stroke. The 'u' is finished at the bottom line, but the 'y' is continued with a descender, which curves in a straight line to the left. Students should be careful not to make the 'y' hooked.
