


C is for Cottage

Assignment 22

- *reading, phonics and grammar.* Complete all of the material found in **Lesson 22**.
- *handwriting.* This week students should complete **Lesson 22** in their handwriting book.
- *poetry.* Memorize stanza 1 of the poem that you will be reciting on Speech Night. You can also work on memorizing the introduction.
- *Daffodil's Day.* Get prepared for **Daffodil's Day on April 12**. (Click on link.) We will be celebrating with a ceremony that includes cake! The daffodils in my yard are already peeking above the ground. (See picture at right.)
- *dictation.* Parents should review the following before beginning the dictation: 1) *ui* words 2) *ai* words 3) capitals (See below.)



RULES FOR CAPITALS

- The first word of every sentence begins with a capital letter.
- The word beginning a quotation is capitalized.
- The important words of titles of poems, songs, newspaper and magazine articles, essays, sermons, books, and other works are capitalized.
- People's names are capitalized.
- The word *I* is always capitalized.
- Calendar events are capitalized, such as days of the week, months of the year, and holidays. (The names of the seasons, however, are not capitalized.)
- proper nouns (names of specific people, places and things)
