
Classical Greek II Assignment 12

- *vocabulary*. Memorize the vocabulary for Lesson 33 in Davis on page 110, Section 267.
- grammar. Memorize the declensions of $\pi \alpha \tau \dot{\eta} \rho$ and $\dot{\alpha} \nu \dot{\eta} \rho$ from the "Dreaded Third Declension" Sheet, and the relative pronoun from the Pronoun sheet posted on the online assignment page. Understand the use of the relative pronoun. (In English the relative pronouns are *who, whose, whom, which, that.*) The relative pronoun agrees with its antecedent in gender and number. As far as its case, it may take on the case of how it is used in a clause (as is always is the case in English), or the case of its antecedent. Examples follow:



EXAMPLES: ἐπίστευεν ὁ ἄνθρωπος τῷ λόγ ψ ὅν είπεν αὐτῷ δ 'Ιησοῦς, the man was believing the word that Jesus spoke to him.

τὰ ἡήματα ἂ ἐγὼ εἶπον ὑμῖν πνεῦμά ἐστιν καὶ ζωή ἐστιν, the words which I spoke to you are spirit and are life.

μένετε έν αὐτῷ ὅς ἐστιν ὁ σωτήρ τοῦ χόσμου, you are abiding in him who is the Saviour of the world.

μνημονεύετε¹ τοῦ λόγου οἱ ἐγὼ είπον ὑμῖν, remember the word that I said to you.
