

Vice and Virtue Assignment 10

- *poetry memorization*. Memorize stanza 1 of Isaac Watts' "Praise to Our Creator"
- *memorization*. Memorize quotation #4 in your appendix.
- *reading and study guide*. Complete Lesson 10 in your study guide and read the corresponding passages in the anthology. This week's stories include "The King and His Hawk" (illustrating the vice of rashness) and John Bunyan's "Good Words and Bad Words" (illustrating the vice of an unbridled tongue). The literary words include *autobiography* and *biography*. Be sure to memorize the words and do the vice and virtue exercise indicated by a triangle (>).
- *poetry and poetics*. Complete Poetry and Poetics, Lesson 10, which deals with the *iambic* rhythmic pattern.
- *grammar*. Complete Grammar Lesson 10, which deals personal pronouns.
- *writing*. Complete the following writing exercise. The assignment should be neatly handwritten or typed, with the title of your composition on the upper left hand side of the paper and with your name. Indent your paragraphs, but do not put spaces between them. The assignment is due the week before Thanksgiving break.
 - * *writing assignment 1*. Write a true story of your own about the rashness of anger. If you cannot think of a time you were angry, think of a time when you or someone else expressed some other undesirable emotion, such as jealousy, meanness, or lack of gratitude, and then regretted it. Use the "The King and His Hawk" as an example account. The story should be about 250 words long. Be sure to use detail, dialog, and description.
