- *Grammar and Translation.* Study Gleason and Atherton, chapter 20. This week's lesson is on comparison of Adjectives, regular and irregular. Remember that there are three forms of an adjective, just as in English: the positive, the comparative and the superlative. The comparative of regular adjectives is formed by adding the suffix *τερος* and the superlative is formed by adding the suffix *τατος*.
