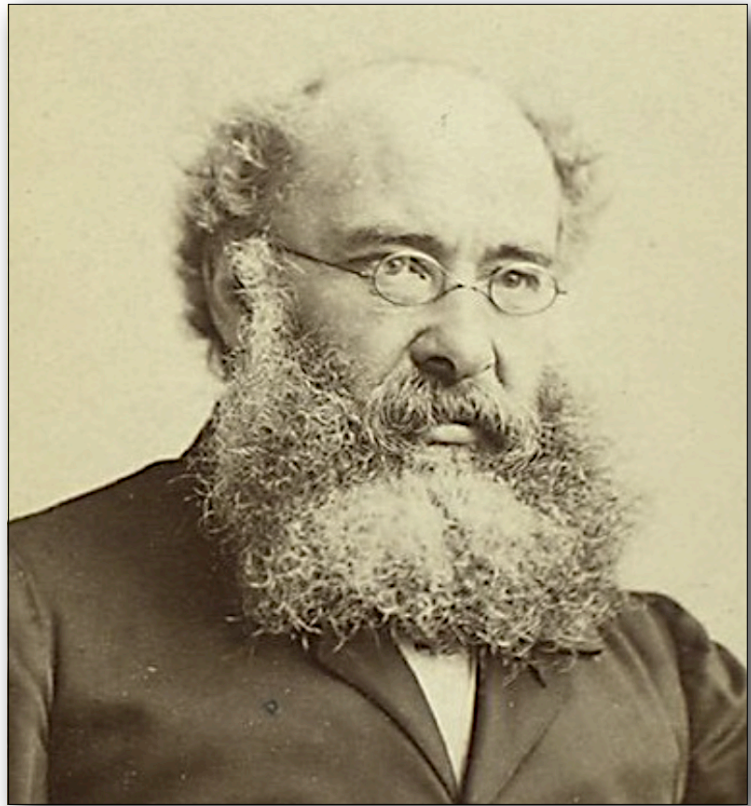


## Vice and Virtue

### Assignment 30

- *poetry*. Memorize stanzas 1–3 of Emily Dickinson’s “Morning.” This is the last poem that you will be memorizing for the year.
- *poetics*. Complete Poetics, Lesson 30, which goes over themes and topics of poetry.
- *reading*. Complete Lesson 30 in your study guide after doing the accompanying reading. This week you will be reading “Plucked out of the Fire” by the famous English Romantic poet and biographer Robert Southey as well as “Farewell” by the Victorian novelist Anthony Trollope (pictured on the right). The passage from the novel *The Warden*, which was the first work that Trollope earned money on. Modest by nature, Anthony Trollope did admit that the novel-reading world did not go mad about it. However, he did comment that he liked the characters that he had drawn up, especially the warden. I think you will agree with him once you read it!
- *literary terms*. This week’s literary terms are *irony* and *dialog*.
