- *Grammar and Translation.* Study Gleason and Atherton, chapter 21. This week's lesson is on adverbs and comparisons. The adverb can be immediately recognized by the *ως* ending. Note that the comparative of the adverb is the neuter accusative *singular* of the corresponding adjective; the superlative is the neuter accusative *plural*. Also, note the irregular comparisons of μάλα, ἄνω, and ἐγγύς:
 - * μάλα. μᾶλλον, μάλιστα
 - * ἄνω, ἀνωτέρω, ἀνωτάτω
 - * ἐγγύς, ἐγγύτερον, ἐγγυτέρω (or ἐγγύτατα, ἐγγυτάτα)
