- *grammar*. This week you are going over the aorist passive participle. Memorize the declension on the **online participle sheet**.



The only tricky thing about forming the passive is that some letters are not easy to pronounce before the θ, and so there are regular patterns of transformation, which is as follows:

$\pi, \beta, \varphi + \theta = \varphi\theta$

example: πεμπω \Rightarrow πεμφθείς, πεμφθείσα

$\kappa, \gamma, \chi = \chi\theta$

example: ἄγω \Rightarrow ἀχθείς, ἀχθείσα

$\tau, \delta, \theta = \sigma\theta$

example: πείθω \Rightarrow πεισθείς, πεισθείσα

There are irregular forms that have to be memorized:

<i>Present</i>	<i>First aorist passive</i>	<i>Future passive</i>
ἀκούω	ἤκουσθην	ἀκουσθήσομαι
βάλλω	έβλήθην	βληθήσομαι
γινώσκω	έγνώσθην	γνωσθήσομαι
έγείρω	ήγέρθην	έγερθήσομαι
καλέω	έκλήθην	κληθήσομαι
λαμβάνω	έλήμφθην	-λημφθήσομαι
Stem ὀπ-	ὠφθην	ὀφθήσομαι.
