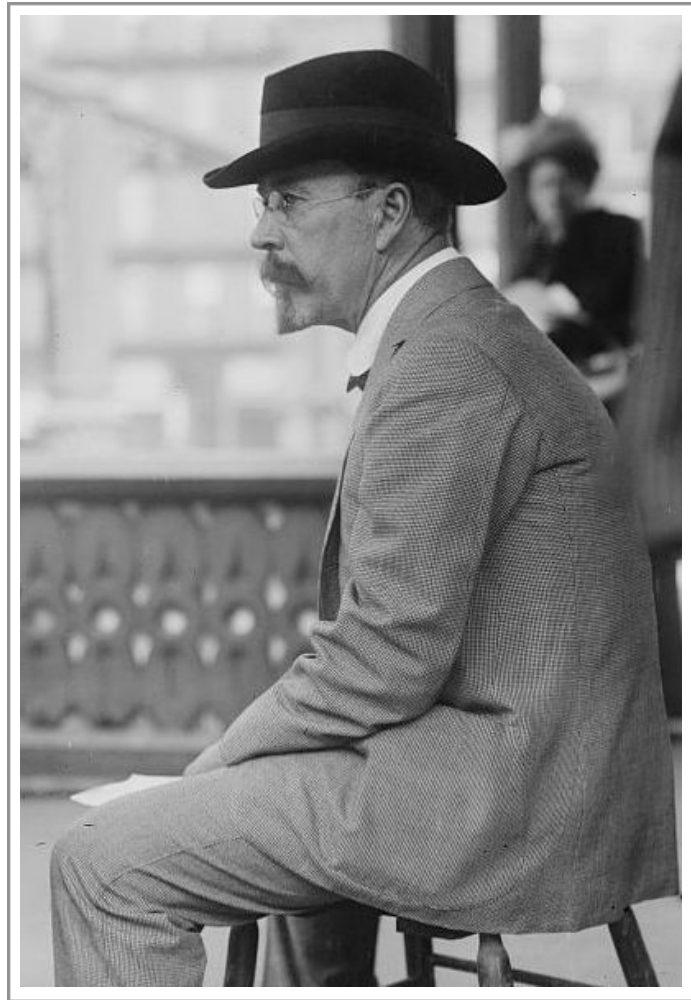


Drama, Writing and Speech Assignment 5

- Read George Orwell's "Such, Such Were the Joys." There are no study guide questions for this essay.
- Read Lincoln Steffans' personal narrative essay "A Miserable Merry Christmas." Be ready to answer questions in class on the content. There is no study guide material. The picture on the right is of Lincoln Steffans, who was noted for his leftist leanings and early support of the Soviet Union.
- Study the rhetorical devices in Rhetoric 5, posted on the assignment page.
