Before giving the dictation, parents should review the following examples. This week, however, students will write only *sentences ending with a quotation*. Notice that when a sentence ends with a quotation, the comma comes *before* the beginning quotation marks and that the ending quotation marks come *after* the end mark. Students should understand that an apostrophe and the letter *s* are added to singular nouns to show possession, even if the word ends in an *s*. John's friend means "the friend of John."

ENDING WITH A QUOTATION John's friend said, "I wouldn't do it." Tim's mom asked, "Why wouldn't you do it?"

BEGINNING WITH A QUOTATION

"I heard a loud cricket in your room," Sam's brother said. "What was that?" Bill asked. "Watch your step!" Jim shouted.

INTERRUPTING A QUOTATION "If you want to have friends," his father said, "you first have to be a friend." EXERCISE A
