5. The servant was putting dessert out for the musicians.

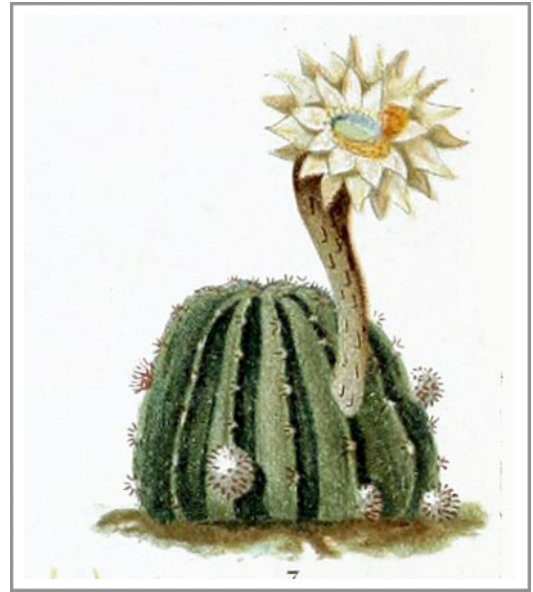
EXERCISE B
