- *memorize quotation.* Τῆς παιδείας ἔφη τὰς μὲν ρίζας εἶναι πικράς, τὸν δὲ καρπὸν γλυκύν, translated “The roots of education are bitter, but the fruit is sweet.” (Aristotle)

Vocabulary of Quotation:

- * παιδεία, education
 - * ρίζα, root
 - * πικρός bitter
 - * καρπός sweet
 - * φημί declare 3rd person, singular imperfect
indicative: ἔφη
- *picture.* Above right is a picture of the philosopher Aristotle, the student of Plato and the teacher of Alexander the Great. His work *Poetics* explains his theory of Greek tragedy.
- *vocabulary.* Memorize the vocabulary for Lesson 47 in **Davis** on page 162, Section 399.
