- *poetry blog*. Study Poetry log #25. This will be your last entry to study.
- *review*. Study all of the poetry bee blogs. *This coming Friday (April 19th) will be our official poetry bee!*
- *poetry for this Friday*. For this Friday, review Jonathan Swift's "Time," Percy Bysshe Shelley's "Ozymandias," Emily Dickinson's "Nature," and Christina Rossetti's "Descent from the Cross."
- *poetry for the Poetry Bee (appendix, not final rounds!)*. These are the poems that you will be asked to recite in the poetry bee in round 2: William Wordsworth's "The Sun Has Long Been Set," Jonathan Swift's "Time," Gerard Manley Hopkins' "Binsey Poplars," Percy Bysshe Shelley's "Ozymandias," Christina Rossetti's "Buds and Babies," Emily Dickinson's "Nature," and Christina Rossetti's "Descent from the Cross."

Important Dates to Remember:

- Continue working on your children's literature project. Before you begin to work on the children's book illustration, make sure that you print out the book on high quality paper. You should have a format that would be appealing to a younger person (larger font, fewer sentences on a page, etc.). The text of your book should be at the bottom of the page. Make sure that you check your spelling and punctuation. Often mistakes are made when changing the font size and format. Remember, attach your finished copy with a paperclip. *Do not staple it or put it in some kind of folder or binder.* Work on your children's book on a specific person (monarch, prime minister, etc.) or event (war, battle, etc.). The project will be due **the first Friday in May.**
