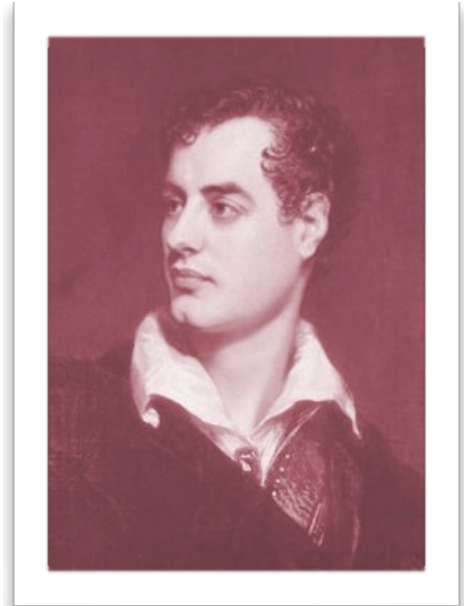


## Vice and Virtue
