- Memorize stanzas 1–6 of John Keats' poem "To Autumn."
- You will soon begin writing your *Animal Farm* essay according to the directions that I will give in class.
 Please do not begin writing it until I help you work out your ideas.
- Read Defoe's "Mrs. Veal,"
 Thackeray's "On Being Found Out" and de Maupassant's "A Ghost" and answer the questions in your study guide. Please remember the following as you read the stories:
 - Defoe's use of realism to give credence to an incredible story
 - 2) Thackery's use of a ghost as a symbol to talk about the guilty conscience (as the ghost is often a symbol of in literature).
 - 3) Remember the title of your reader *Speaking in Symbols*. We have talked about how Orwell spoke in symbols, particularly through a allegorical fable, to express the evils of totalitarian governments. Now we will be talking about the use of the ghost as a symbol of the conscience.
