
English Literature and History Assignment 5

- Complete Lesson 5 in your study guide and all of the accompanying reading. Make sure that you study the new words and do all of the exercises. This week we start the Medieval Period with the Medieval monk historian Bede, the Medieval poem (rendered into prose) *Beowulf* and Rudyard Kipling's "Harp Song of the Dane Women," which is a poem *about* the Medieval Period.
- This week you will be learning just teeny bit of the Anglo-Saxon language, which I had the opportunity of studying for a year many moons ago when I had to read Beowulf in the original. Beowulf begins this way:

 *Hwæt! we Gardena in geardagum.



- You will not be doing any of the writing assignments mentioned in Lesson 5, as you will working on your Writing Response for Lesson 5—the comparison essay on *King Lear*.
- We will need to have shields, of course, for our battles, and so you will make them according to your own particular heraldry. Begin making your shield using the directions given on the online assignment page ("Materials Needed"). This assignment will be due the third Friday of November.
