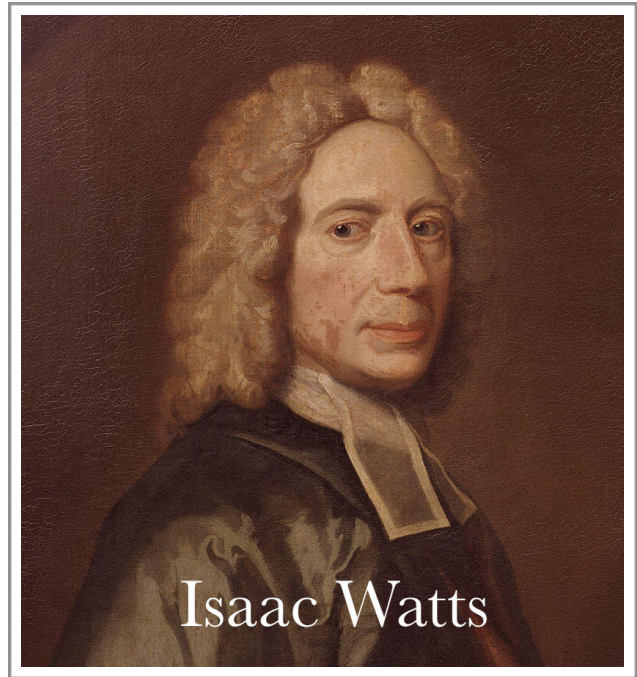
Before giving the dictation, teachers should review the following: 1) *eight* words 2) *cious* words 3) apostrophes with singular and plural nouns.
