


Vice and Virtue Assignment 22

- *poetry memorization.* Poetry Memorization: Stanzas 1–5 of Whittier’s “The Barefoot Boy.”
- *literature.* Complete Lesson 22 in your study guide after doing the accompanying reading. You will be reading a passage from Benjamin Franklin’s autobiography titled, “Mr. Whitefield” and a story titled “Lyman Dean’s Testimonials.”
- *literary terms.* This lesson’s literary terms include *foil character* and *dramatic irony*.
- *vice and virtue.* Note that this lesson’s vice and virtue assignment is to think about the elderly. If you *can* do the assignment, please write it in about one or two sentences and tell what you did in class.
- *picture.* On the right is a picture of George Whitefield’s portrait. He was noted for his “lazy” left eye.
