Lesson 36

- Know the conjugation of the first aorist indicative active

- Know that verbs ending with a short vowel are lengthened in the first aorist:

αγαπάω → ηγάπησα
ποιέω → έποίησα
πληρόω → έπλήρωσα

- Know that a σ and π turns into a ψ; that a σ and a κ turns into a ξ;
that a σ and a ζ or a θ turns into σ
