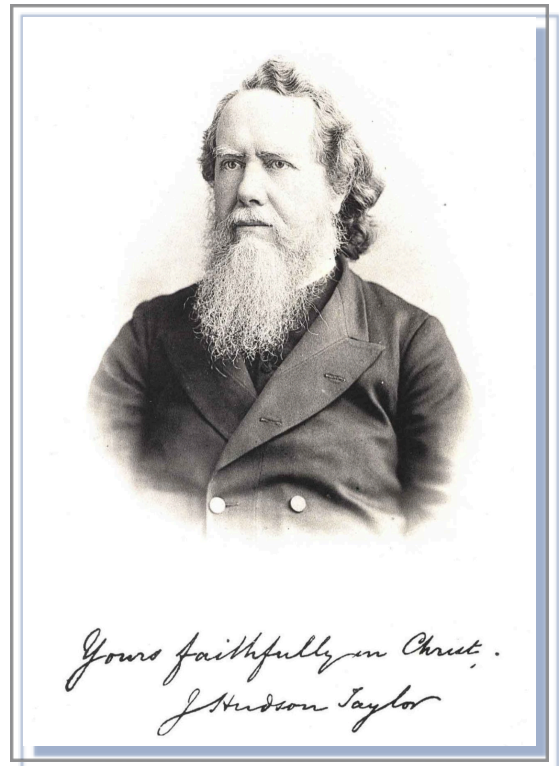


## Vice and Virtue Assignment 16
