
## B is for Bear

## **Assignment 10**

To prepare your child for Lesson 10 you may write out any number of the following words on a piece of paper. Circle the *wr* letter combination to reinforce the spelling: *wrist*, *wren*, *writhe*, *write*, *wrote*, *written*, *writing*, *wrong*, *wreath*, *wreck*, *wring*, *wrath*, *wrinkle*, *wrench*, *wrestle*, *wretch*.

Your child may try to guess the meaning of the words writhe, wreath, wring, wrath, and wretch in context. Read the following sentences and have your child choose the correct word from the multiple choice. Where possible, gestures may help make the meaning clear.
