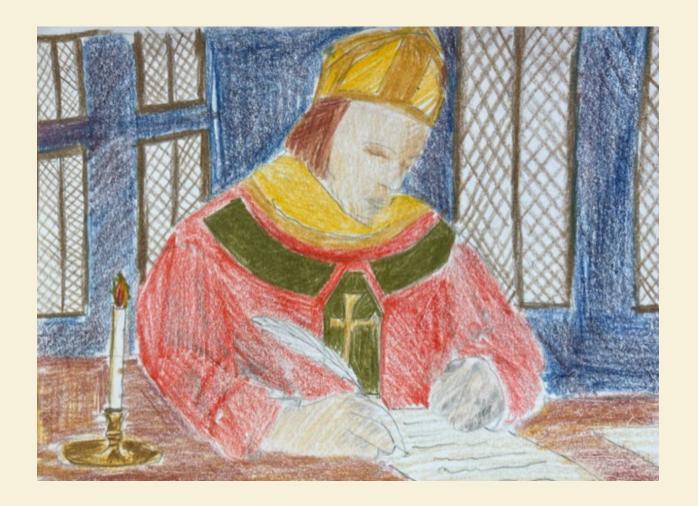




Saint Thomas Becket was born in 1118 to a London merchant. He loved fine clothes and parties but could not have them because he was poor.



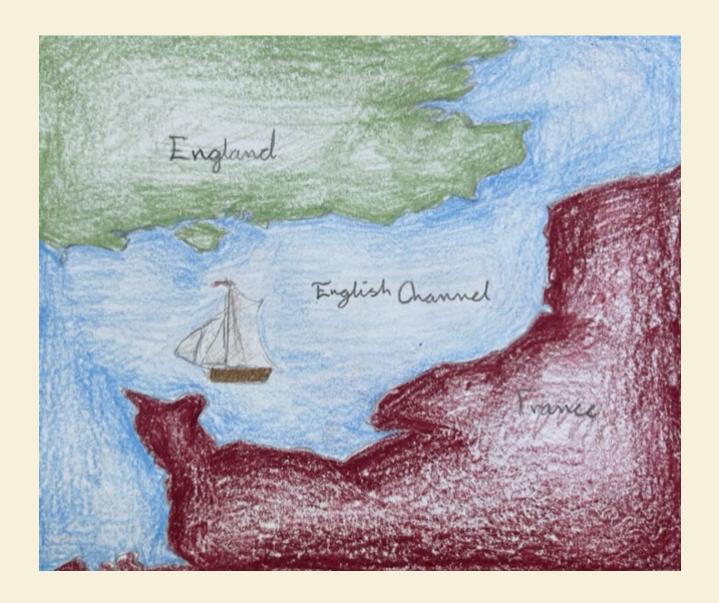

So during the night, Thomas Becket decided to leave England and go to France. The King of France didn't like the King of England, so he was happy to keep Becket safe.



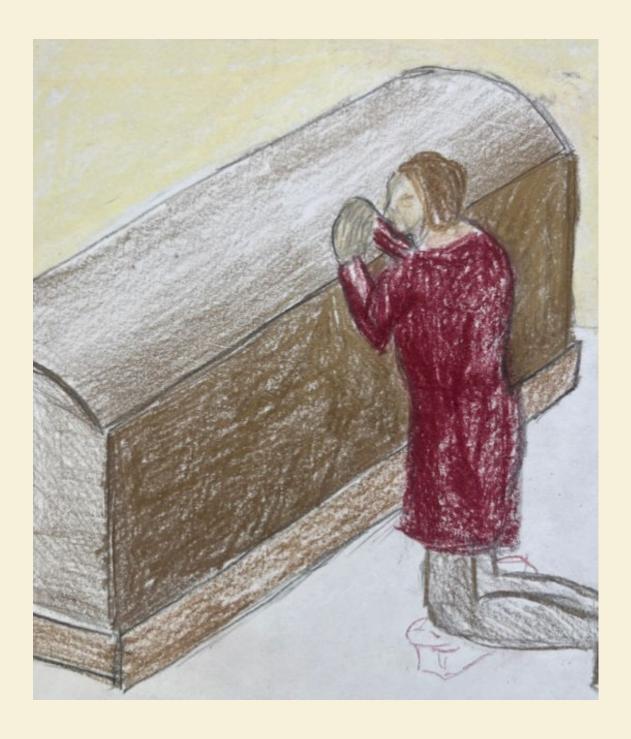

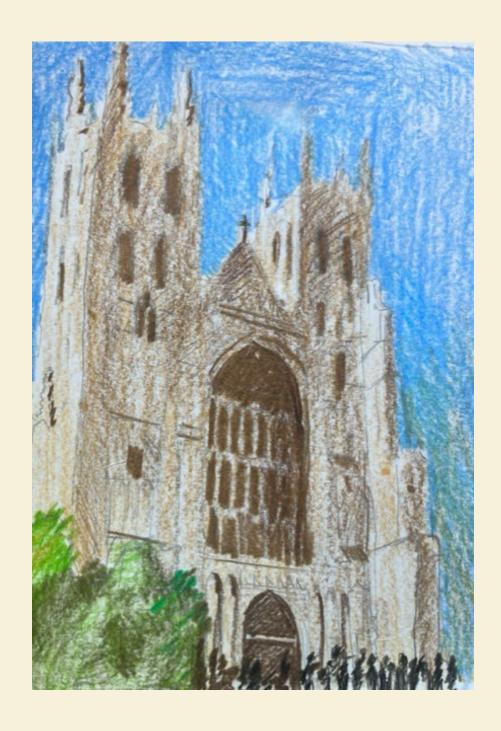
