

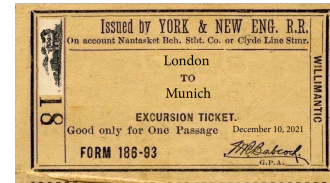
Rules for Tickets

The trip from Broomall to Paris requires five tickets.

- 1- Broomall to New York
- 2- New York to London
- 3- London to Morocco

Optional sightseeing detour to Munich with privileges

- 4- Morocco to Berlin (or when taking detour, Munich to Berlin)
- 5- Berlin to Paris



A train ticket requires 7 hole punches.

A plane ticket requires 5 hole punches

A jet ticket requires 2 hole punches.

A plane ticket costs 300 marks.

A jet ticket costs 500 marks.

When in London, you may take a detour to Munich for sightseeing, which will require *one* additional ticket. The detour will allow you, while you have the ticket, to have an advantage in contests, as you will have two opportunities to answer a question, not three.

When you have a traveling companion for a certain trip, you will need only half the hole punches in your ticket—3 for train ticket, 2 for plane ticket, and 1 for a jet. Traveling companions include the following:
