INTENSIVE PRONOUNS

Both the following sentences are translated “the man himself.”

ὁ ἄνθρωπος αὐτός
αὐτός ὁ ἄνθρωπος

IDENTICAL PRONOUN

When the word αὐτός is preceded by the definite article, it is translated “the same.” The following sentence is translated “the same man.”

ὁ αὐτός ἄνθρωπος

THE INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

The indefinite pronoun is identical to the interrogative pronoun and is declined the same, except for the accent. The accent lies on the ultima, and has a circumflex in the genitive in the masculine, feminine and neuter genders. The indefinite pronoun is an enclitic, and thus loses or keeps its accent according to the rules regarding enclitics.
