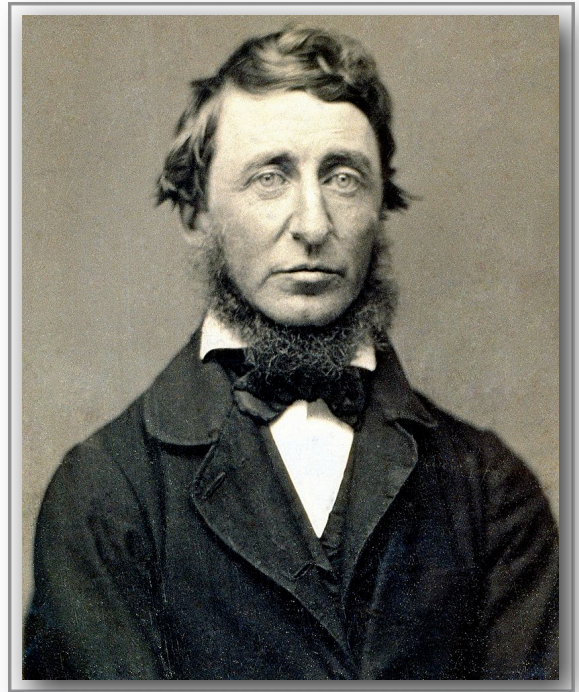


## Drama, Writing, and Speech

### Assignment 12

- Read Edward Verrall Lucas' "Thoughts at the Ferry," "Gentlemen Both," "On Finding Things." Be sure to study all of the study guide material. At the bottom of this assignment sheet is a picture of Edward Verrall Lucas.
- Read Henry David Thoreau's "Where I Lived, and What I Lived for" and "The Village." Be sure to complete all of the study guide material. On the right is a picture of Henry David Thoreau.
- *writing.* Write your narrative or musings essay. Remember to use the essays that we have read for models of imitation. If you can, use humor. Make sure that your essay has a conversational tone, but do not use slang. If your essay is a musing (conversational) essay, you can have a loose structure and use narrative. The narrative must recount a personal experience. Both essays, whichever you do, must have a central idea. Be sure to use detail, description, and dialog to underscore your point. The essay is due when you return from the Thanksgiving break.

- For the L4 assignment you will be assigned the following: 1) recite the passage every week, starting the fourth week in October. 2) write a critical analysis of the passage, which will be due the second week in November. 3) write a narrative or a musings essay on an experience that illustrates the passage. 4) complete a creative project which will be due when we meet together the fourth week in March.
