- I have another pessimistic quotation for you to memorize. This time it is by the ancient Greek tragedian Aeschylus, who lived before Euripides and Sophocles, the other two great playwrights: Θάνατος τῶν ἀνηκέστων κακῶν ἰατρός, which means *Death is the healer of incurable diseases*.
 - * Θάνατος, death
 - * ἰατρός, physician or healer
 - * τῶν ἀνηκέστων (genitive of ἀνήκεστος)
 - * κακῶν, evil, disease (genitive of κακός)
- Last week, we started going over words in the first declension. Here are some more 1st declension feminine words that I would like you to memorize :

ἀδελφή	sister
ἀρετή	excellence
ἀρχή	beginning, authority, office γῆ γῆς ἢ earth δίκη justice; legal case
εἰρήνη	peace
κεφαλή	head
μάχη	battle
νίκη	victory
τέχνη	art, skill
τιμή	value, honor
τύχη	luck, fate
ψυχή	breath, soul

- Review the following declension:

	Singular	Plural
Nominative Case (Subjects and Subject Complements)	ἡ φωνή	αἱ φωναί
Accusative Case (Direct Objects)	τὴν φωνήν	τὰς φωνάς
Genitive Case (Possessive)	τῆς φωνῆς	τῶν φωνῶν
Dative Case (Indirect Objects)	τῇ φωνῇ	ταῖς φωναῖς
Vocative (Noun of Direct Address)	φωνή	φωναί

- Translate the following:

Ι. 1. αἱ ψυχαὶ τῶν ἀνθρώπων σώζονται. 2. ἐν ἀρχῇ ὁ λόγος ἠκούετο. 3. ἡ ἐντολὴ τῆς ζωῆς ἐλέγετο ὑπὸ τοῦ κυρίου. 4. αἱ γραφαὶ ἐδιδάσκοντο ἐν τῷ ἱερῷ. 5. ἐξέβαλλον ἐκ τῶν κωμῶν. 6. ἡ διαθήκη ἐγράφετο τοῖς ἀνθρώποις.
