- I have another pessimistic quotation for you to memorize. This time it is by the ancient Greek tragedian Aeschylus, who lived before Euripides and Sophocles, the other two great playwrights: Θάνατος τῶν ἀνηκέστων κακών ἰατρός, which means *Death is the healer of incurable diseases*.
 - * Θάνατος, death
 - * ἰατρός, physician or healer
 - * τῶν ἀνηκέστων (genitive of ἀνήκεστος)
 - * κακών, evil, disease (genitive of κακός)
