- Study for the *National Greek Exam*. Remember that the exam is scheduled for Friday, March 10 at 10:00. You can study for it by reviewing the following.
- Review the following terms: *proclitic*, *enclitic*, *postpositive*, *crasis*, and *elision*. If you do not know what they mean, look them up or ask me. It is quite possible, even likely, that the test will contain one of these terms.
- *Study vocabulary*. Review the National Greek Exam vocabulary list.
- *Study grammar*. Review 1) verbs and their conjugations 2) nouns and their declensions 3) adjectives: attributive and predicate. 4) miscellaneous grammatical details such as the use of ὅτι, ὥστε, and ἴνα. You can find all this material in the Davis book as well as on my online grammar sheets.
- *Take another test—if you have time*. I have posted the test on line with answers.

Examples of Crasis

- τὰ ἐμά → τᾶμά "my (affairs)"
- τὸ ἐναντίον → τοῦναντίον "on the contrary"
- τὸ αὐτό → ταυτό "the same"
- τὰ αὐτά → ταυτά (plural of the previous example)
- καὶ ἐγώ → κᾶγώ "and I", "I too"
- καὶ ἐμοί → κᾶμοί "and to me"
