

Greek III Assignment 2

- *Quotation.* Νίψον ἀνομήματα μὴ μόναν ὄψιν. This is a Greek palindrome, meaning “Wash the sins, not only the face.” Do not be a hypocrite; inner purity is just as important as outward. In other words, “Be whom you seem to be,” or, if you’d like it put more simply, *Never imagine yourself not to be otherwise than what it might appear to others that what you are or might have been is not otherwise than what you had been would have appeared to them to be otherwise.* The spelling is different from classical Greek, such as μόνον.
 - νίπτω wash
 - ὄψις face; appearance
