#### Dictation

This week we return to the

apostrophe with an oral exercise. Parents should first read the sentence, then repeat the italicized word and ask if the word has or does not have an apostrophe. Remind your child that words with an apostrophe show possession.

#### ORAL EXERCISE 6 ON APOSTROPHES

1. Where did Dan's father go?

Answer: *Dan's* has an apostrophe. (The father "belongs to" Dan.)

2. We bought some *apples*.

Answer: *Apples* does not have an apostrophe. (Nothing belongs to the apples)

3. We found the woman's purse in the closet.

Answer: Woman's has an apostrophe. (The purse belongs to the woman.)

4. My mother's plants are turning brown.

Answer: *Mother's* has an apostrophe. (The plants belong to the mother.)

5. Help the teacher with her *books*.

Answer: *Books* does not have an apostrophe. (The books belong to the teacher; the teacher does not belong to the books.)

6. Pick up Timmy's toys.

Answer: Timmy's has an apostrophe. (The toys belong to Timmy.)

7. Polish the *desk's* knobs.

Answer: *Desk's* has an apostrophe. (The knobs belong to the desk.)

8. Rip out the *pages* from the notebook.


Answer: *Pages* does not have an apostrophe. (Nothing belongs to the pages.)

9. Are you going to borrow your *friend's* bike?

Answer: *Friend's h*as an apostrophe. (The bike belongs to the friend.)

10.Listen to Nathan's cough!

Answer: *Nathen's* has an apostrophe. (The cough "belongs to" Nathan.)



Before giving the dictation, review the kn, or and qu letter combination and remind students to capitalize the first word in the sentence and to include an end mark. It is very important for students to sound out words of more than one syllable.
