- *vocabulary.* Memorize Section 196 on page 83 of Davis.
- *grammar.* We are now going over the “dreaded third declension.” Memorize the declension of ὄνομα on Section 199 on page 85 of Davis. Note that the word is neuter, and so the nominative and accusative forms are identical. If you prefer, you can memorize them from the sheet *Dreaded Third Declensions* under “Materials Needed” or click [here](#). (It might be easier, as the words are listed in our usual order of case.) Also, remember that the neuter plural subject often has its verb in the singular:

ταῦτά ἐστι τὰ καλὰ δῶρα, *these are the good gifts.*

- *translation.* Translate Section 204 on page 86 in Davis, from Greek to English.
- *quotation to memorize.* Memorize the following quotation from Periander of Corinth, one of the seven sages of Greece (all sages are pictured below): Μελέτη τὸ πᾶν. (Practice is everything.)
