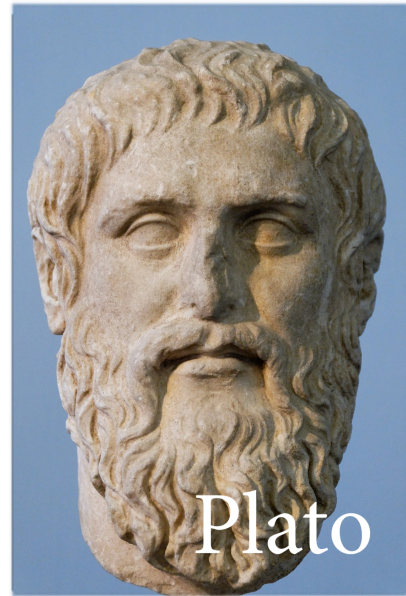


Classical Greek II

Assignment 8

- *vocabulary*. Memorize the lingual mute stems in Section 222 on page 93 of Davis. Know that lingual (or dental) refers to those letters made by the tongue and teeth (example: the English letter *t*); that labial refers to those letters made by the lips (example: the English letter *b*); and that palatal refers to those letters formed by the palate, or back of the mouth (example: the English letter *g*).
- *grammar*. Memorize the declensions of ἔλπις, χάρις, and νύξ. You can find these words under “The Dreaded Third Declension.” They will be easier to memorize using this sheet. Also, memorize the point made in section 230 on page 96 of Davis regarding expressions of time and case.
- *translation*. Translate Section 231 on page 96 in Davis, from Greek to English.
- *quotation to memorize*: Θεός ουδαμῆ ουδαμῶς ἀδικός, or God is never, in no way unjust. The quotation is found in a work of Plato (427-347 BC).
