
## **Great Books Seminar Assignment 17**

## **Long-Term Assignments**

A little dessert suited to the tea will be served. You will also be given a menu from which you may order a wide variety of black, green and herbal teas. After the tea I will discuss the themes of the novel, talk about the author and prepare you for watching one episode from the 6-part BBC production on the novel. Afterwards, we will have our dinner with period entertainment, whist and charades. This will be a formal affair, and you must dress accordingly: boys with button-down shirts, suit jackets (or suits), and dress pants; girls with skirts or dresses.
