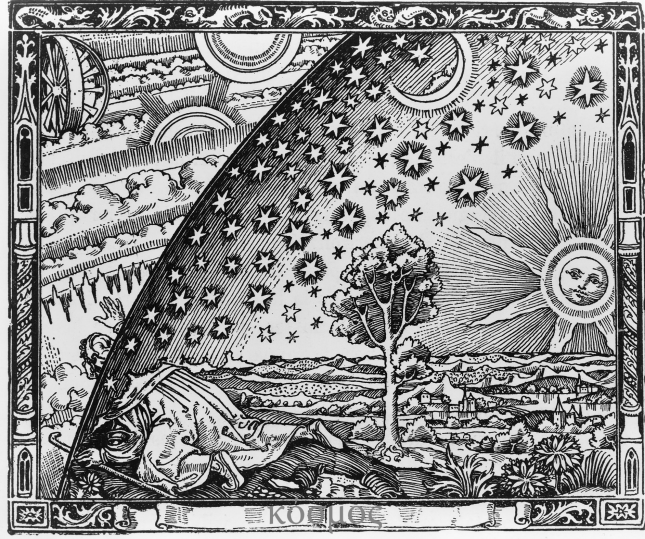


Classical Greek Assignment 6

- Study for the Greek test and take it. Hand it in to me this coming Friday.
- The following quotation is also taken from the New Testament. It is translated “I am the light of the world.” The word κόσμος means “world” and the word φῶς means “light.” *Cosmetics* is called such because the word κόσμος really means order (before the world came into being there was *chaos*), and when a woman puts on makeup she is putting her face in order. The word *photo* is from the genitive form of φῶς.

- Read chapters 35–41 of **Guerber’s *Story of the Greeks***.
- Learn the following about case:
 - * Use genitive case when following prepositions meaning *of, off, out, from, away from*.
 - * Use dative case with the prepositions meaning *in, on, among, at, by, with (agency), to or for (the sake of)*.
- Memorize the following words (some of the are review):

ἄγγελος, *angel, messenger*

διδάσκαλος, *teacher*

ἄνθρωπος, *man*

θάνατος, *death*

ἀπόστολος, *apostle*

κύριος, *Lord*

Memorize the declension of the word ἄνθρωπος (below). Notice where the accent marks are!

Accusative Case	ἄνθρωπον	ἄνθρώπους
Genitive Case	ἄνθρώπου	ἄνθρώπων
Dative Case	ἄνθρώπῳ	ἄνθρώποις
